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SUNRISE SUPERKIDS PRIMARY SCHOOL ADMISSIONS POLICY

1. GENERAL

1.1. The Primary School admits learners from Grade R to Grade 7.

2. COMMITMENT TO FAIR PRACTICES

2.1. The school aims to provide an environment where the race, language, culture, religion and socio-economic circumstances of each learner do not act as unreasonable barriers to him accessing or progressing in any aspect of school life.

2.2. The school is committed to ensuring that no form of unfair discrimination against any applicant is practiced during the school's admission process.

2.3. The school openly follows and supports the Christian faith and participates in Christian practices, however, does not discriminate against any learner of another faith. Any learner who is comfortable with the Christian ethos may apply to Sunrise Superkids for admission.

3. LANGUAGE OF LEARNING AND TEACHING

3.1. The language of learning and teaching at the school is English.

3.2. The School offers Afrikaans as First Additional Language from Grade 1 to Grade 7.

4. DOCUMENTS AND INFORMATION REQUIRED FOR THE ADMISSION OF A LEARNER

4.1. The following documents are required upon application for admission:

- Completed application form issued by the school
- Completed indemnity form
- Learner's birth certificate
- Learner's immunization/vaccination card
- Copy of ID of parent, guardian and/or person responsible for payment
- 2 Passport size photos of the learner
- Original transfer card for the learner where he/she is transferring from another school
- Proof of the residential address(es) of the learner.
- Salary slip of person responsible for payment
- Account reference (at least one)

4.2. Please note that it is an offence to provide false information regarding the age of a child.

4.3. The school reserves its rights to verify all information and documentation supplied by an applicant for admission and reserves its rights to take legal action against any applicant who intentionally provides false information and documentation.

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- 4.4. Learners who are not citizens of South Africa and whose parents are in possession of a permit for temporary or permanent residence issued by the Department of Home Affairs may apply for admission to the School. All documents listed above must be submitted as part of the admission application, as well as a certified copy of the parents' permit(s).

5. CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION

- 5.1. The selection of learners for admission to the school shall be based on an assessment of the following factors (in no particular order):
- 5.2. Whether a complete set of admission application documents has been submitted;
- 5.3. Whether the learner has met the promotional requirements for the grade immediately below the grade to which the admission application relates;
- 5.4. Whether there are places available at the school, given the capacity of the school (Unsuccessful applications for admission of a learner are to be recorded chronologically on a waiting-list).
- 5.5. Whether the school is able to meet the educational needs of the learner (including but not limited to any special education needs of the learner); and
- 5.6. Whether the learner will benefit from the programme of the school given his/her proficiency in English, being the language of instruction of the school. The inability of a learner to communicate effectively in English as well as Afrikaans as First Additional Language, may place an unreasonable limitation on his/her academic progress at the school and could therefore result in the learner not being admitted to the school.

6. SCHOOL FEES

- 6.1. A schedule of the monthly school fees payable to the school is available from the school website and office.
- 6.2. Where an application for admission to the school is successful, the parents concerned are under a statutory duty to pay the relevant school fees.

7. REGISTRATION FEE

- 7.1. Where an application for admission is successful, parents will be required to pay registration fee of R500 once-off.
